STEP-BY-STEP PLAN

1. Check Voter Registration Status

Go to elections.maryland.gov -> Click "Look Up Voter Information"

- O YES, I am eligible and my information is up to date!
- O NO, I am ineligible and still need to register through the website

2. Knowing Your Candidates

Using The "Look Up Voter Information" Tool you'll be able to see information about your congressional, legislative, and election district. This information is important because, it will help you identify your political candidates! Copy this information below from the site:

3. Research Your Candidates/Political Officials

Learn about the candidates' views on issues which are meaningful to you! Pay attention to the sources from which you are getting information. Use verified sites, for example, sites ending with .gov or official sites directly affiliated with the candidate or their political party.

4. Decide Whether to Use Mail-In Ballot Or Vote In Person

Away for college? Health reasons? If you believe you may have a hard time getting to the polls on election day, using a mail in ballot may be a great option for you!

For Mail-In Ballot requests to go: boe.baltimorecity.gov

By checking your **voter information online,** or using your voter ID card, you can determine your correct polling site. Also, verify your polling site hours of operation and ensure you have safe and reliable transportation on election day! Check which voting centers are accessible for voters with physical challenges.

- YES, I know my polling site and plan to vote **in person**!
- YES, I will request my Mail-In Ballot and plan to vote by mail!

Use **boe.baltimorecity.gov** and **elections.maryland.gov** as a resource to stay updated on voting information.

8. What To Bring When Voting

Although some polling places may not require ID, it is still good practice for first time voters!

- O Identification such as a **drivers license**, **state issued**, **student card**, **etc**.
- O Voter ID Card

9. Cast Your Ballot!

- Make sure to follow all instructions as written on your ballot
- There's no rush! Take your time selecting your candidates and pay attention to the different government roles from different offices that may appear
- Have confidence! All the work has been done by filling out this guide so you should feel prepared to cast your ballot!

10. Tracking Status Of Ballot

After casting your ballot whether in person or by mail, you can track the status of your ballot go to **voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch** and that's it!
